Chairman's Chatter

I start this newsletter by wishing everybody a belated very happy, healthy and successful 2018 with lots of fun filled camping. This newsletter was due out in January however our PRO has with committee agreement delayed it until the SER Anniversary Meet subcommittee had met so that he could provide the best possible information for the event which is set out below. The original meeting date was cancelled due to a short flurry of snow leading to dangerous driving conditions and the revised date last week was also cancelled due to a heavy fall of snow (I hope that this is not an Omen), thus the meeting turned into an exchange of emails and phone calls. Details are not quite fully finalised however they are now set out below for your information.

As we look forward to this years camping events Roger has again worked hard in procuring suitable sites for us only for Wealdon Borough Council to refuse planning permission for our Spring Bank THS at Sharnfold Farm despite the best efforts of our Exempted Camping team at HQ. Despite this setback we have many other meets to attend however **we are in need of stewards** for many of them. If we don't get stewards, then the meets will be cancelled. Our immediate focus is on our Easter meet and AGM, this year more about both of these later however please consider joining the committee as two of our members are not standing for re-election on health grounds. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them both for all their efforts and support over the preceding years.

Data Protection

I circulated an email on 12 February 2018 relating to the changes in Data Protection, as set out again below. Currently just under half the recipients of this newsletter have responded. Please consider the information below very carefully and in particular the no response action/result.

When I was working I had a responsibility for ensuring compliance with the Data Protection Act and thus I was always up to date with the changes (what a boring long winded document) however I am now totally out of date with the legislation therefore I have taken advice from a friend who is a solicitor and legal adviser to the RFU and whose communication to me regarding this issue relating to "The Wooden Spoon" (a rugby charity) drew my attention to the latest change in the act. I have been advised that the East Sussex District Association is also expected to be able to demonstrate compliance

Apparently under GDPR you will have numerous rights to protect the data you have provided to the East Sussex District Association. Personal data must be protected against unauthorised or unlawful processing and use.

Your personal details will always be stored securely by East Sussex District Association and will only be used to communicate with you on East Sussex District Association, South Eastern Region or other relevant Camping & Caravanning Cub activities.

East Sussex District Association values your privacy and promises to respect it. We will never share your information with third parties.

Currently, in addition to your name, the only data we hold relating to you is:

- committee members and others holding a position on behalf of East Sussex District Association: - email, telephone number (including mobile numbers where relevant) and home address
 - Other members: - email address only (as above)

Whilst all of you have previously authorised us to hold your email address for use as detailed above, over the years many of these authorities have been verbally communicated. Clearly, we wish to maintain contact via the newsletter and other relevant emails which are always sent bcc to protect personal data however, in order to comply with GDPR we apparently now need your formal permission to do so.

N.B. - To ensure our full compliance a failure to provide an **"Opt In"** response will be deemed to be an **"Opt Out"** and your details will be deleted on or very soon after the 25th of May 2018.
