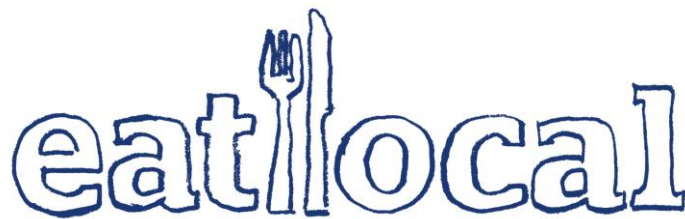

CAMPSITE COOK OF THE YEAR 2017

Competition Rules for Regional Heat Contestants

*You are required to cook one main course dish of your choice.

*It must be a meal that can be cooked at your pitch on a campsite using either a gas stove or gas barbecue. (All NFOL *finalists* will be asked to cook their meal on the Cadac

Carri Chef 2 Barbecue that they won in the region/section heat). Any Carri Chef accessory or top may be used but this must be brought to the cook off by the participant.

*No ovens/microwaves or electrical equipment allowed

*You must be able to **cook** your meal in 30 minutes or under. Contestants can bring pre-washed, peeled and cut vegetables, measured out flour etc. Meat can be pre-marinated. However, no finished sauces. Sauces must be made within the 30 minutes.

*Ingredients and all cooking utensils must be supplied by the entrant on the day of cooking.

You will be judged on:

*The taste and appearance of your food

*The dish's suitability as a campsite-friendly recipe.

*Whether you have included an *Eat Local* element in terms of ingredients used, style or flavour.

Terms & Conditions

*The competition is open to current members of the Camping and Caravanning Club, who are over 18, except employees of The Camping and Caravanning Club, and Cadac UK, their families or anyone connected with the running of the competition.

*Only one entry per person.

*No monetary alternative to the stated prizes is available and the prize is non-transferrable.

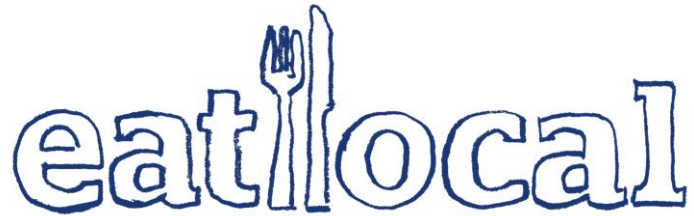
*The promoters reserve the right to provide an alternative prize of equal or greater value.

Brief notes from the SER Council meeting 03 April 2017

N.B. some issues have been covered elsewhere in this newsletter therefore they are not repeated here.

National Councilor

It was noted that the membership fees were to be increased by £1.00 from the 1st of April 2017 vis Paper membership becomes £43.00 PA and online only become £38.00PA.

PRO

Following the last three years' success we are back on the marketing trail and to date we have formerly signed up 17 new members between Trevor & Pauline Wilson (14 over two successive weekends) and Alan & Chris Armstrong (3 on a cold weekend with low footfall)

I am still in need of volunteers as follows:

Sites Coordinator

Ideas for where we can hold the 2018 Seminar are still required, we need a place to be able to camp and have rooms where the seminar can be held.

Constitution

Council approved the new constitution and retained 15 as the number of elected Councillors by a majority vote.

There are currently vacancies of 1 for 3 years and 2 for 2 years. There will not be a vote this year due to there being more positions available than Councillors standing.

Chairman's report for 2016

We need more volunteers to steward meets, we cannot rely on a very small number of people to cover the stewarding. It is not onerous and in fact it is very sociable. Big meets are run by the committee however booking in stewards are still required.

Also, we currently only have one volunteer to tow the trailer which fully loaded weighs 1600kg. The use of the trailer is on average twice a year however if the one volunteer is not available then the meet will suffer as there will be no marquee or other items which it contains. Whilst mentioning the trailer I have to note that after talking about a change of storage location for almost two years since the land owner changed, we are now desperate for a new location as the current landowner is redeveloping the land where it is stored.

After delays in gaining the requisite club approvals due to the fact that they had again tweaked their logo, our new pennon has arrived.

Honorary Secretary's Report for 2016

Last year I advised that a draft new constitution had been circulated by HQ for comment. All the comments received have been taken on board by HQ and a final version has been agreed and circulated for incorporation. This was only circulated in February thus the committee have not had the chance to review it to present it to today's meeting therefore this will be held over until the 2018 AGM. As far as I can tell the key changes are:

1. The named Officers are now only the Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. It is felt that each DA should consider who else they want on their Committee such as Sites Officer, PRO or Youth leader etc.
2. The minimum number of Committee to be six members. (we currently have 8 in our constitution), the Executive to remain at five
3. The DA, and section PRO's and Youth leaders may have a vote only if they are an elected member, this brings all in to line with the Regions Youth Leader and PRO structure.
4. DA's, Sections committees shall be divisible by two.

I am delighted to confirm that we have had three families who have requested a change from their allocated DA to ours. One family new to the club made a direct contact with me and we have been notified by HQ of another family who had shown an interest in joining our DA, welcome letters plus other issues have been sent to them. We are also delighted to have welcomed John & Doreen Hughes (formerly WKDA) to some of our meets.

Honorary Treasurer's Report for year ending 31st December 2016

2014 and 2015 saw a decline in camping numbers, however I am pleased to announce that we had a slight increase in 2016, that was with three weekend meets less but one more THS – the Air Show turning from a five-day weekend to a THS.

Looking at the Income and Expenditure Account you can see that we have a slight surplus.

The Balance Sheet shows that we still have more than adequate funds in the bank account and with HQ. The prepayment is a deposit with Seaford Head for the Sea fishing meet.

Site Secretary's Report

The `working party` meet at the Crowborough Club site last year was not the success I had hoped for due to a very disappointing attendance. The site managers were very grateful for the effort put in by the few, this is always a way of putting something back into the Club we so enjoy a little more support would be good.

June again this year saw the Region A.G.M. back at White House Farm attracting units from all over the South East, unfortunately also attracting some very wet weather causing the land owner to pull the plug on our own Birthday Meet which should have been held the following weekend.

A report back from Joan and Colin Pannell on the course fishing at Wylands lakes did not bode well, again due to very poor (nil) camping support and it is doubtful that it will run beyond this year. However again the T.H.S there through August produced very good numbers, as did the Sharnfold Farm Airshow meet, run as a T.H.S for 2016, so my grateful thanks to all those who helped to make these events successful.

The Sea Fishing meet seems to be attracting more and more units, not just for the fishing opportunity, but for the great walks from the site over the cliffs to the Cuckmere estuary, and the pub of course. Unfortunately, this year the fishing and walk on the Saturday were a wash out. However, some of us did manage to get the walk on Sunday.

Seaford Head School saw us back for our Christmas party and Disco, well supported both from campers and evening visitors, the consensus seems to be that Seaford is the better venue for this event so I am hoping to be able to coincide it with the Seaford town Christmas Fair week end as much as possible to add a bit more atmosphere to the occasion.

In conclusion, I do intend to carry on with the meets approximately two weeks apart, giving the members a chance to do other things. I would like to thank my Committee colleagues and the various Stewards for their support throughout the year. I am quite concerned that we are not getting `Booking in Stewards` for the Committee run meets, please think about this, Your Committee is small, we all do other jobs for the Club and are busy enough at these meets, all we ask is for someone to collect the fees and take care of the paperwork when on site, after all it is your D.A. please give this some thought.

Equipment Officers report

As last year, I have blocked up the trailer so that its wheels are no longer on the ground and the weight is not pressing on the wheel bearings which over a prolonged period is likely to damage them.

The owner, of the kennels where the trailer is stored, has started to develop the field for dog training so we need to find another storage place ASAP.

I have seriously searched for a locksmith to cut another key for the hitch lock without any joy, probably because of the age. We could have a serious problem if the only existing key goes missing so I suggest that the DA invest in a new lock which will have a number of keys and replacements being easily available.

By way of early advice my email address will be changing shortly due to the imminent closure of my current ISP.

Election of Committee

All members due for re-election were willing to stand and were elected en bloc.

The elected committee remains unchanged.

Post AGM Open Forum

1. Allen Russell from the South-Eastern Region was then invited to speak on behalf of the Region. He started by thanking the ESDA members for their support on the working party for the NFOL 2017. He continued by advising that whilst it was now too late to be included in the block booking there was still plenty of time to book a space that the event albeit the number of spaces is lower this year therefore early booking is advised. He finished by giving a brief resume of the layout, need to arrive together if you wish to camp together vis there will not be any saving of places by earlier arrivals. He also made a plea for Stewards at the Region THS at Maplehurst Farm, noting that it was likely to be cancelled until Harry & Yvonne had stepped in however more volunteers are still required.
 - a. Arthur Hovell thanked him for all his efforts on behalf of the South-Eastern Region, the NFOL 2017 etc.
2. Harry advised that the contact details had recently been deleted from the website, this was due to inappropriate use by hackers. Full contact details will still be included within the newsletter. Allen Russell advised that Surrey DA had been having a similar issue with SPAM and inappropriate emails etc.
3. Geoff Baldwin asked if it was possible to resurrect the table top sales for people to sell on their formerly loved equipment which was no longer in use. Harry advised that there was an opportunity at the South-Eastern Region Anniversary meet and the committee would consider this for one of or more of the bigger events.
4. Sandy Grant asked if we would be paid a hire charge for the use of our marquees. Allen Russell confirmed that a payment would be made.
5. Alan Thorpe questioned if our trailer insurance policy covered for it to be towed by any member of the DA as historically he believed that it only covered for committee members to tow it. This will be checked with the Policy and/or the insurer.
6. Harry then advised the meeting that he had been approached by a member some eighteen months previously about having a DA facebook closed group. Whilst at the time he was monitoring two other local Facebook groups and had found that they were only having items placed on them by the administrators however more recently they had taken off with a lot of useful information from members of the group including requests for advice and speedy responses by other members. He therefore put it to the floor as to whether the membership would like to have a closed group facebook page.

7. After some discussion, a show of hands was asked for and resulted in approximately one third for a facebook page, one third against and one third abstained thus there will be no further development of this item at this time.
