A Brief Synopsis from the SER Council Meeting **09 April 2018**

Appointed National Councillor – Allen Russell

Structure of Council In answer to a question, the Director General advised the Council that he had met with the Club's Lawyers and outlined the situation in respect of the Executive Committee positions and the fact that they can be removed from their Executive positions by vote of the members and that Council wished to secure these positions. Work on this was being carried out and proposals would shortly be made to the Council.

Chairman reported that since the last meeting P Henson had not been re-elected to National Council and therefore would not be appointed as Director of the Camping Club of Great Britain and Ireland Ltd. He proposed that R Talbot as the new Club Vice Chairman should be appointed to the Directorship and the Committee approved the recommendation.

As you all know Geoff (with the support of Pat) has done an extraordinary amount of work for the East Sussex District Association and we are eternally grateful to them both and look forward to continuing to see them at our meets.

I am delighted to record that recently Mr & Mrs R Matthews and Mr D Knight who are registered East Sussex District Association members were presented with 50 years' membership awards.

I would like to close by thanking all the members of the committee and site stewards for their sterling work last year which is very much appreciated.

Honorary Treasurer's Report for year ending 31st December 2017 – Jane Tanner

Good Afternoon Everybody

What a difference a year can make. Last year I started my report saying how good Easter had been. This March as you are all aware Cathy had to cancel as the field was too wet.

2017 was a good year over all. There was an increase in the number of units out and nights camped. This was helped by the weather and the bigger meets going ahead unlike 2016. There was actually a decline in the numbers for our quiet weekends and the THS at Wylands, which makes a significant contribution to our running costs. Specifically, hall or barn hire, food and entertainment at our Birthday and Christmas meets. Thanks go to Colin and Joan, with their helpers who so faithfully steward Wylands, Dave and Lynn with Mick and Jeannie who steward Sharnfold. Thanks also to all the people who stewarded weekend meets. Without you there wouldn't be any camping.

Looking at the Income and Expenditure Account you can see that we have a deficit. The raffle income is up because our Easter and Birthday meets took place. The income from the Birthday meet raffle was donated to the charity Children with Cancer based in Polegate. You can see that as a donation in the expenses.

The camping expenses are up as we bought new pennons and new bungees and bits for the marquees.

After the Sharnfold THS in May we suddenly found we couldn't return the trailer to its place of storage. Dennis kindly let us keep it at Sharnfold till the Birthday meet by which time we had found another venue. However, the expenses are up as we lost 7 month's rent.

The Balance Sheet shows that we still have more than adequate funds in the bank accounts. The Debtors and Prepayments consist of money paid to Seaford Head for Christmas meets booked for the next three years and the Sea fishing meet, plus trailer rent paid in advance, also some raffle prizes bought for 2018. The creditor is for site fees that weren't paid until January this year.

Before I receive any questions, there may be, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Ian Kirbell and Wendy Dickson for auditing these accounts.

Auditors' report – Ian Kirbell

This year it falls to me to speak on behalf of the Auditors' and all I can say is what a treasure we have for our Treasurer.

As usual for the audit this year Jane emailed to Wendy and I the club accounts for us to study and pore over at our leisure before meeting with Jane to check all paperwork and to sign off the accounts.

This year both Wendy and I had even fewer queries to raise on the accounts – in fact there were only 2 queries which were quickly cleared up when we were able to examine the receipts and VAT invoices (or lack of a correct VAT invoice in this case which could have saved the DA a few more pennies). Therefore, after a pleasant evening chatting to Jane, Wendy and I, as the auditors, had no hesitation in signing off the accounts as being correct and recommending them to the members for your approval and those are the accounts that you see before you now.

Once again Wendy and I would like to thank Jane for her hospitality for the audit and to congratulate her on another year well done and we hope that she will continue for as long as possible as it will be difficult to find another more qualified replacement.

Site Secretary's Report – Roger Wynn

January 2017 for me started with the Region dinner dance at the Cumberland Hotel Eastbourne, a well-attended event good for meeting up with camping friends. This is very well organized, and thanks go to Jenny Croney, the current Region Chairperson.

Overall the 2017 Camping season showed an increase over 2016 with increased camping through our w/e meets although our THS numbers were down.

No `working party` at the Crowborough Club site in 2017 due to a lack of support, also there was very little support in 2016, thus to save any embarrassment I did not arrange a meet for 2018.

Easter week-end had 19 units attend Roy Hill Wood with use of the barn to make it cheerful. You may recall, we went through a period of cancellations of our Easter meets therefore some members make other arrangements for this holiday time, so 18 was a good number.

May Day week end 2017 at White House Farm, always a favourite venue & I would like to thank Doreen & John Hughes for stewarding the meet. As newcomers to East Sussex D.A. they jumped in at the deep end with a larger meet, 29 units and Committee run entertainment so well done to them.

Also, in May Sussex Farm, stewarded by Yvonne & Harry, another favoured site that usually attracts units from other areas so 9 units was a bit of a disappointment.

Our traditional week long THS at Sharnfold Farm, run by Mick, Jeannie, Lyn and Dave attracted a good many returning units. This is run in conjunction with the Club supported `National Camping week` and showed nearly a 15% increase. Unfortunately, as you know we have had to cancel this for 2018 thanks to Wealden District Council.

The end of June and we were back at White House Farm for the D.A Birthday meet, 23 units attending and stewarded by Terry and Sue Harvey. We put the marquees to good use with entertainment and a Disco.

Early July the Laughing Fish Isfield. The first stewarding experience for Sue & Peter who managed to coerce deputies Mick & Jeannie while a deal was done on a new tow car. It's a few years since we were at this site, a lot of work has been done by the villagers to make it a very nice field. A bonus was the Long Man Morris men to entertain us at the pub on the Saturday evening.

As I advised at the AGM 2016 the Course fishing meet at Wylands lakes has been dropped from our annual list due to lack of support.

The midyear visit to Roy Hill Wood 2017 had a lot to compete with over 2016; However, Sue and Laurie managed to create a quiet meet with a creditable 13 units.

Wylands Lakes THS through August showed a significant reduction for 2017, very disappointing for Joan & Colin who always do a sterling job for us there. It is possible that the introduction of the `Air show` meet could have had an affect; also of course the NFOL 2017 at Hickstead may have been a distraction albeit it had been well advertised by the Region PRO as a great location to visit before the NFOL.

September and we were back to White House Farm, for Uckfield Carnival week-end. Only 9 units but the weather was kind and those who ventured into the town enjoyed the atmosphere on the Saturday.

September back to Sussex Farm for the FOL, many thanks to Kevin & Angela for taking care of the paperwork & booking in 21units in total. With the aid of a few gazebos and the loan of a small region marquee we were able to have a good social evening undercover enjoying some cheese & wine provided by Mick & Jeannie.

The Sea Fishing meet saw Terry and Sue looking after Seaford Head School, this is always well supported and not just for the fishing. There is now a traditional walk from the site over the cliffs to the Cuckmere estuary and a pub lunch. I think perhaps we should rename it a `pub walk` with sea fishing as an optional extra. Space is at a premium at this venue, so things do get a bit cosy.

Our Christmas party and Disco was held at Willingdon School, only 8 units camping was disappointing for Terry and Val, but it was well supported with evening visitors. A fish n chip supper organised by Mick May and the usual evening disco all went very well. A local Christmas fair held in the school hall on the Saturday morning, provided us with something a little different and added a bit more to the week-end.

It is my intention to continue with the meets on alternate weeks to give our members a chance to do other things. I'd like to thank the Committee and the various Stewards for their support throughout the year.

The idea of having secondary `Booking Stewards` for the Committee run meets seems to have worked well. I would ask for member support as stewards for meets, it's not difficult. If we do not get stewards then the meets will be cancelled at short notice, so please think about it, your Committee do other jobs for the Club and are busy people. All we ask is for someone to collect the fees and take care of the paperwork when on site; after all it is your D.A. and we would all like it to continue.

Equipment Officer's report – Geoffrey Baldwin

The trailer is now at Jane's house as we have been unable to find anywhere else suitable or at a reasonable rent. It was blocked up over the winter period as usual to prevent damage to the tyres and wheel bearings. I have recently unblocked it so that it is now ready for use again.

I have been unable to fit the tow hitch security lock kindly donated by one of our members however I was able to adapt the existing one utilising parts from the donated one thus we now have two keys again for the hitchlock.

As the trailer is now some distance from my house and the reduced amount of time I have available during the year I have to, with some regret, tender my resignation as equipment officer, a post I have filled for more than 10 years.

It was noted that under the new constitution the President was deemed to be appointed at the AGM. It was the committee's proposal that Arthur Hovell be appointed again for his tenth year and he has agreed to stand

Requests for proposals from the floor resulted in no nominations.

Jane Tanner reinforced the need for new members and new ideas plus the fact that we only hold 4 meetings per year and the more committee members there are the less work each member needs to do.

Jane also stated that we work hard or at least the secretary, site secretary and treasurer do. When the above failed to produce new volunteers, Jane went on to ask that the members are very careful how they criticise the way we run weekends.

Election of Auditors

Upon request both Ian Kirbell and Wendy Dickson agreed to be the auditors again for the fiscal year.
